## THE ROLE OF JOKES IN THE TEACHING OF ANATOMY

## Introduction

Anatomy as it is known today has a wider scope than mere "cutting up". It is the foundation of the whole art of medicine and it introduces the student to most of the medical terminologies including medical jokes. Anatomy is vast and the founding fathers of anatomy were versatile. Since anatomy is the foundation of medicine, anatomists have to be at the fore front of medical education.

Anatomists have to make the teaching of anatomy lively. They have to make the knowledge of anatomy relevant in clinical practice, sports, social life etc. Anatomists have to continue to widen the horizons of anatomy in these days of molecular biology. Jokes help to make the learning of anatomy a fun'

Question and answer, Q & A, interactive sessions, along an inclined plane, starting with what is very obvious to what is less obvious, excite the interest of students. This method was used by Morel in the Sadness of Christ and Lewis 2 in Screw tape Letters.

## Joke II: STAY TOGETHER AND REJOICE (STAR)

MRA: Why is it that many medical students are asked to withdraw from the Faculty of Medicine after the 2nd MB BS examination?

MRI: In the past, few medical students were advised to withdraw from studying medicine but these days the number has increased remarkably.

MRA: Why is it so?

MRI: There are many theories: some students cheat at examination halls, some get someone else to sit the examinations for them; some get involved unduly ip extracurricular activities and miss their lectures and practicals etc.

MRA: What meaning does it have for those outside the ivory tower?

MRI: Stay Together and Reconcile \* Stay Together And Relax \* Stay Together And Rejoice \*

MRA: I am beginning to like stars

MRI: You better do. A little bit of alcohol is good for the stomach

MRA: A friend of mine thinks that it is a sin to take any alcohol including STAR beer.

MRI: If he or she is a Christian you can ask him to read the following passages in the Scripture:

- 1. JN 4:46 He went again to Cana in Galilee, where he had changed the water into Wine.
- 2. LK 7:33-34 For John the Baptist comes, not eating bread, not drinking wine, and you say, "He is possessed". The Son of Man comes, eating and drinking, and you say, "Look, a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners"
